Irish immigrants escaped the great potato famine only to suffer severe discrimination and poverty in New York.




Families were torn apart. Children starved.


FIVE POINTS GANGS

Out of this desperation, the lawless expanse of the Five Points ghetto took shape, filled with Irish immigrants and powerful gangs.





Where every policeman was corrupt and the fire fighters were just as likely to start a fire as to extinguish one.
